Example: i) $4\text{ l} = 4 \times 1000\text{ ml}$
 $= 4000\text{ ml}$.

(ii) $6\text{ l } 325\text{ ml} = 6 \times 1000\text{ ml} + 325\text{ ml}$
 $6000\text{ ml} + 325\text{ ml} = 6325\text{ ml}$
