Exercise: 2.5

Q5. Convert the following Fractions into decimal numbers:

$$(iii) 3 \frac{5}{16}$$

$$= 3 + \frac{5}{16}$$

$$= 3 + 0.3125$$

$$= 3.3125 \text{ ans.}$$

Q10. Express 5 cm in metre and kilometer.

Solution:

$$100 \text{ cm} = 1 \text{ meter}$$

$$5 \text{ cm} = \frac{5}{100} \text{ m}$$

$$= 0.05 \text{ m}$$

$$1000 \times 100 \text{ cm} = 1 \text{ km}$$

$$5 \text{ cm} = \frac{5}{100000}$$

$$= 0.00005 \text{ km}$$

Exercise 2.6

Q5. Find the area of a rectangle whose length is 5.7 cm and breadth is 3.5 cm.

Solution:

$$\text{Length of rectangle} = 5.7 \text{ cm}$$

$$\text{Breadth of rectangle} = 3.5 \text{ cm}$$

$$\text{Area of rectangle} = \text{length} \times \text{breadth}$$

$$= 5.7 \times 3.5 \text{ sq. cm}$$

$$= 19.95 \text{ sq. cm}$$

Q10. A vehicle covers a distance of 43.2 km in 2.4 litres of petrol. How much distance will it cover in one liter of petrol ?

Solution:

$$\text{Distance covered in 2.4 litres} = 43.2 \text{ km}$$

$$\text{Distance covered in 1 litres} = \frac{43.2}{2.4}$$

$$= 18 \text{ km.}$$

Q12. If the product of two decimal numbers is 38.745 and one of the numbers is 2.7, find the other.

Solution:

$$\text{Product of two numbers} = 38.745$$

$$\text{One number} = 2.7$$

$$\text{Other no.} = \frac{38.745}{2.7}$$

$$= 14.35$$

Exercise 2.7

Q2. (i) $\left(\frac{1}{4} \text{ of } 2 \frac{2}{7} \right) \div \frac{3}{5}$

Solution:

$$\left(\frac{1}{4} \times 16 \frac{2}{7} \right) \times \frac{5}{3}$$

$$= \frac{4}{7} \times \frac{5}{3}$$

$$= \frac{20}{21} \text{ ans.}$$
