4. Differentiate between Kharif and Rabi crops.

Ans. The main differences between Kharif and Rabi crops are:

Kharif crops	Rabi crops
<ul style="list-style-type: none">*also called monsoon crops *seeds are sown at the start of monsoons * crops are harvested in November/ December *eg. rice, jute, cotton	<ul style="list-style-type: none">*also called winter crops *seeds are sown at the start of winter * crops are harvested in April/May *eg. wheat, gram, oilseeds
